Elementary Principal Rosendahl shared with the board an overview of the social and emotional health of her staff and students in her building. She explained the restructured changes that have been made to programs to engage students and staff into conversations that identify areas of need. All grade levels are doing a community service-learning project this year. The Elementary staff likes the 1:30 early out every Wednesday for Professional Development and grade level collaboration time, and the staff is excited for the upcoming PLC training.

NOTICE FOR GRANT WRITING AND ADMINISTRATION WRIGHT COUNTY IS REQUESTING PROPOSALS FOR GRANT WRITING & ADMINISTRATION SERVICES TO ASSIST WITH A PROJECT FUNDED WITH COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) FUNDS THROUGH THE IOWA ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (IEDA).

The County wishes to apply for funds to complete the remodel of the Wright County Resource Center to make it handicap acceptable and move the Public Health Department to this building. This will allow a larger space for the vaccine clinics, testing of COVID-19, make it capable to do the Women Infants & Children (WIC) Clinic there and bring back the Parent Connections program to this building who is teaching young parents how to be parents. This along with other programs and a one place stop for citizens in Wright County. Other programs already in this building is Mental Health Community and Family Resources, Veterans Affairs, Berry Hill counseling, Department of Human Services, Building Families and the Juvenile Court Officer.

The selected contractor will work with the county to ensure compliance with CDBG program requirements. Activities will include but are not limited to project reporting, preparation of disbursement requests, and other activities required under the state of Iowa's CDBG program. A. The work to be performed under this contract is subject to the requirements of section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968, as amended, 12 U.S.C. 1701u (section 3). The purpose of section 3 is to ensure that employment and other economic opportunities generated by HUD assistance or HUD-assisted projects covered by section 3, shall, to the greatest extent feasible, be directed to low- and very low-income persons, particularly persons who are recipients of HUD assistance for housing.

B. The parties to this contract agree to comply with HUD's regulations in 24 CFR part 135, which implement section 3. As evidenced by their execution of this contract, the parties to this contract certify that they are under no contractual or other impediment that would prevent them from complying with the part 135 regulations.

C. The contractor agrees to send to each labor organization or representative of workers with which the contractor has a collective bargaining agreement or other understanding, if any, a notice advising the labor organization or workers' representative of the contractor's commitments under this section 3 clause, and will post copies of the notice in conspicuous places at the work site where both employees and applicants for training and employment positions can see the notice. The notice shall describe the section 3 preference, shall set forth minimum number and job titles subject to hire, availability of apprenticeship and training positions, the qualifications for each, and the name and location

of the person(s) taking applications for each of the positions; and the anticipated date the work shall begin.

D. The contractor agrees to include this section 3 clause in every subcontract subject to compliance with regulations in 24 CFR part 135, and agrees to take appropriate action, as provided in an applicable provision of the subcontract or in this section 3 clause, upon a finding that the subcontractor is in violation of the regulations in 24 CFR part 135. E.
