

Clemons gave an update on the Secondary Roads. There were 9 work orders completed last week with 5 of them building snow fences. Blades went out and winged back shoulders as well as v-picked intersections, hills, and curves. Trucks were out on roads last week with blowing snow and ice patches on the roads. Crews filled sheds with sand and salt mix as well as hauled new sand to mix to the Clarion shed. The standing corn snow fence cost about \$0.26/foot while a traditional orange fence is about \$0.93/foot with the material cost included.

Eric Rector, Wright County Conservation, spoke on the land purchase in Section 16 of Grant Township. There is 200.31 acres being purchased with 82.31 of them being residual ownership, subject to the wetland easement. The last two ag drainage wells in Wright County reside on this land and will be closed. There are 3 intakes that drain into Lake Cornelia that the Conservation will take measures to reduce the sediment level and phosphorus level and to improve the water quality of Lake Cornelia.
