Wright County Public Health is still holding walk in vaccination

Jay LeFevre with the Wright County Insurance Committee met to present the 2022-2023 renewal for property and casualty and workman's compensation insurance. The total premium for ICAP and IMWCA for Wright County is \$285,302. The ICAP premium increased \$45,913 due to the increase in liability. The IMWCA premium for workman's compensation decreased \$18,309. LeFevre also discussed the replacement cost of the Courthouse is currently at \$12 million. The Board asked Jay to look into this amount and have a discussion in the near future regarding if this \$12 million is enough.
