Project Scope: The project consists of a new baseball and softball field done with synthetic turf. Between the two fields is a building that houses concessions, restrooms, and a press box. Outside of the softball field will be one hole of golf also in synthetic turf, and other related Work indicated in the Drawings and Specifications. No such final payment will be due until the Contractor certifies to the Board of Directors of the Clarion-Goldfield-Dows Community School District that the materials, labor, and services involved in the final estimate have been paid for in accordance with the requirements stated in the specifications.

The Clarion-Goldfield-Dows Community School District of Clarion, Iowa is exempt from paying Sales and Use Tax and will supply Contractor with an "Iowa Sales Tax Exemption Certificate" and an authorization letter to allow the Contractor to buy equipment and material for the project without paying Sales and Use tax.

The work shall commence within **ten (10) days** after receipt by the contractor of a written notice to proceed, and shall be **substantially completed on or before the 22nd day of July 2022**, subject to any changes in the contract period as provided for in these specifications, and granted by the Board of Directors. The Work **shall be finally completed by**, and ready for final payment, on or before the **12th day of August 2022**, subject to any changes in the contract period as provided for in these specifications and granted by the Board of Directors of the Clarion-Goldfield-Dows Community School District.

By virtue of statutory authority, a preference will be given to products and provisions grown and coal produced within the State of Iowa.

In accordance with Iowa statutes, a resident bidder shall be allowed a preference as against a nonresident bidder from a state or foreign country if that state or foreign country gives or requires any preference to bidders from that state or foreign country, including but not limited to any preference to bidders, the imposition of any type of labor force preference, or any other form of preferential treatment to bidders or laborers from that state or foreign country. The preference allowed shall be equal to the preference given or required by the state or foreign country in which the nonresident bidder is a resident. In the instance of a resident labor force preference, a nonresident bidder shall apply the same resident labor force preference to a public improvement in this state as would be required in the construction of a public improvement by the state or foreign country in which the nonresident bidder is a resident.

Chairman Pro-tem, Kluss called the regular meeting of the Wright County Board of Supervisors to order at 9:00 a.m. Members present were Kluss and Rasmussen and Helgevold present via telephone. Minutes of the previous regular meeting of May 24, 2021 were read and approved.

Approved claims for payment. Sandy McGrath with Wright County Public Health gave an update on the COVID cases in Wright County. There is 1 new positive case since last week. A total of 41.6% of Wright County residents have been fully vaccinated. Wright County Public Health will still be holding clinics and will have Pfizer, Moderna and Johnson & Johnson available this week. McGrath stated there will be a booth set up at the Wright County Fair this year for individuals. Students from Eagle Grove school and Belmond Klemme school that wanted to get vaccinated have received the vaccine last week. Students ages 12 to 18 that would like to receive the vaccine may go to the clinics held at Wright County Public Health or receive them at the doctor's office.

Sandy McGrath touched based on the fly problem in the county. McGrath stated to put fly strips up with dates and times to track them. McGrath did reach out to a couple of the colleges in Iowa to see if they had a Grad student interested in doing a study on the fly situation.

Motion by Rasmussen and seconded by Kluss to approve the fire-works application for 4-G Pyrotechnics for June 26th, July 3rd and July 17th. Motion carries.

Adam Clemons, Wright County Engineer, gave an update on the Secondary Roads. In the rock program, BMC has completed 32 segments out of 73 segments and Martin Marietta has completed hauling for roads south of Highway 3. The shoulder rock in the southwest quadrant has 11 miles left and will be completed. There were 18 work orders completed last week. The crews are starting to get ready for large scale ditch clean outs.
